

4-H HORSE LEADERS' SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

This award is for \$200 and is open to currently enrolled 4-H Equine Project members only. It is open to any field of study at a 2- or a 4-year college or vocational/technical school. Up to two (2) scholarships may be awarded. The typical applicant would be a recent high school graduate, beginning post-high-school education, but might also include high school student in Running Start, using scholarship to pay for books.

An alternate will be chosen if the applicant is unable to attend school. Applications must be submitted by the Awards Application deadline and will be awarded at the 4-H Achievement Program. The certificate will be awarded at the program. The check will be issued when school starts, or thereafter when information is supplied by the winner(s).

Applicant must be a senior 4-H member and have completed at least 4 years in a 4-H equine project by the time of application. Minimum grade point average (G.P.A.) is 2.0. Please submit:

- 1) A signed and completed "Kitsap County 4-H Awards Entry Form"
- 2) A sealed transcript from school or test scores in case of home schooling.
- 3) Two sealed letters of recommendation. One will be from a club leader or project leader, (not a parent if a parent is the leader) and one from another unrelated individual (example, teacher, pastor, etc.).
- 4) An up-to-date 4-H record Book for the year just completed.
- 5) An essay (length determined by applicant) outlining the applicant's plans for school, discussing chosen field of study and how further education will support career plans.

This entry has five (5) components: the 1) County 4-H Awards Entry Form with Addendum, 2) Essay, 3) Record Book, 4) Two letters of recommendation and 5) a sealed transcript ***must be placed in a large envelope*** and turned in to: Kitsap County Co-operative Extension Office, 345 6th Street, Suite 550, Bremerton, WA 98337-1874 by the Awards Application.
